The Four Distinctives of the Church

C. Third Distinctive - Worship

Acts 2:42 – breaking of bread Corinthians 11:123-34 -

Worship defined – definition defines function!

- kissing of the hand – A bowing of the knee – WORTHSHIP
- True worship involves both the inward and outward of the person

John 4:1-24

V 7-10 Breaking the Norms of our Prejudices

- He broke the norms of a prejudice society to show this woman a path of reconciliation to God. Will we do the same with our prejudice? **

V 10-14 The Preeminence of Jesus

- The unfulfilling Jacobs well - Are you greater than our father?
- Yes I AM! 4:25, 26

V 15-19 A life that doesn't Match up

- Five husbands and living with another – Can't worship anywhere in this kind of condition

V. 21-24 - Jesus answers in 3 parts:

1. The Father – Worship is no longer centered around a place Worship is of the Father who is Spirit
2. In Spirit – worship is no longer about a form but of the spirit of worship Phil. 3:3; Ezekiel 11:19
3. In Truth - Worship is no longer about ritual but about heart and life of worship Romans 12:1
 - Present – to stand beside – picture of standing before God as a living sacrifice
 - **Holy and acceptable – was does this mean to you?**
